**NOTICE OF CONSUMMATION OF AGREEMENT REGARDING ACQUISITION OF
WORLD COLOR PRESS INC. BY QUAD/GRAPHICS, INC.**

On July 2, 2010, Quad/Graphics, Inc. announced that its acquisition of World Color Press Inc. (formerly “Quebecor World Inc.”) was complete (the “Acquisition”). The closing follows overwhelming approval by shareholders of both companies. A copy of the news release can be found at <http://www.qg.com/news/news.asp>.

On July 21, 2009, Quebecor World Inc. and its affiliated debtors successfully emerged from protection under the Companies’ Creditors Arrangement Act in Canada (“CCAA”) and chapter 11 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code.¹ Since their emergence, the Debtors in these chapter 11 proceedings (collectively, the “Reorganized Debtors”) have been working diligently to resolve all proofs of claims filed in these proceedings, and other open issues. To that end, the Reorganized Debtors have implemented claims resolution procedures, which were approved by order of this Court entered November 5, 2009 (the “Claims Procedures”) (Docket No. 1978). The Reorganized Debtors expect that the claims resolution process will continue in accordance with the guidelines set forth in the Claims Procedures irrespective of the Acquisition, as the Reorganized Debtors proceed to complete the administration of these chapter 11 cases, including the resolution of all filed proofs of claim, uninterrupted by the closing of the Acquisition.
