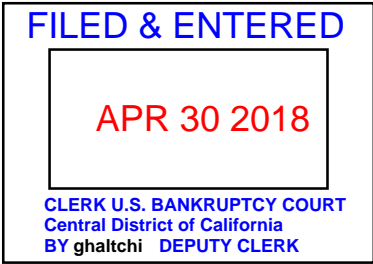

**ORDER APPROVING DEBTOR'S

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The Court having considered the *Debtor's Application for Entry of an Order (1) Approving Retention of Donlin Recano & Company Inc. as Claims and Noticing Agent to Debtor Effective as of the Petition Date; and (2) Granting Related Relief* [Docket No. 86] (the “Application”)¹ filed by Debtor and Debtor in Possession B&B Liquidating, LLC, f/k/a B&B Bachrach, LLC (the “Debtor”), together with the *Declaration of Nellwyn Voorhies* attached to the Application with exhibits attached thereto, the Debtor’s Notice of the Application [Docket No. 87], and the *Statement of Disinterestedness for Employment of Professional Person Under FRBP 2014* [Docket No. 88]; it appearing that this Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334; it appearing that due and adequate notice of the Application having been given under the circumstances pursuant to the Court’s *Order Granting Emergency Motion for Order Limiting Scope of Notice* [Docket No. 44], which is incorporated herein by reference; no timely response or request for hearing having been filed with respect to the Application; and after due deliberation and good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Application is granted.
2. The retention of Donlin, Recano & Company, Inc. (“DRC”) as claims and noticing agent in this chapter 11 case is approved pursuant to section 156(c) of title 28 of the United States Code, effective as of February 16, 2018.
3. DRC shall be compensated based on the services it provides at the rates set forth in the Engagement Agreement, with such compensation treated as an ordinary course administrative expenses of the Debtor’s estate pursuant to section 503(b)(1)(A) of title 11 of the United States Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101, et seq. (the “Bankruptcy Code”).
4. The Bankruptcy Court shall retain jurisdiction over any dispute that may arise with respect to the Debtor’s employment of DRC. Upon dismissal of, or closing of, the Debtor's bankruptcy case, or in the event of a dispute regarding DRC’s engagement, the forum for such a dispute shall be determined by the terms of the Engagement Agreement between the Debtor and

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DRC.

5. If the case is converted to chapter 7, DRC shall contact the Clerk’s Office within three days of the notice to Claims and Noticing Agent of entry of the order converting the case.

6. DRC is authorized to input all proof of claim information into the Court’s ECF system, and shall not be required to transport all original documents to the Federal Archives Record Administration at the close of the case.

7. All transfers of claims must be processed by the Clerk of the Court. If DRC receives requests to transfer fees and the accompanying payment of the transfer fee DRC shall forward them to the Clerk of the Court.

8. Within 20 days of the end of the month DRC shall submit a statement of all fees incurred in the prior month to the Debtor, the Clerk of the Court, the Office of the United States Trustee, and any Committee appointed in this case.

9. In its capacity as the Claims and Noticing Agent in this case, DRC will not be an agent of the United States and will not act on behalf of the United States. DRC will not consider itself employed by the United States government and shall not seek any compensation from the United States government in its capacity as the Claims and Noticing Agent in this case. By accepting employment in this case, DRC waives any rights to receive compensation from the United States government in connection with the Debtor’s case.

10. DRC shall transmit a copy of the claims register to the Clerk of the Court every week or as frequently as requested by the Clerk of the Court.
