**ORDER GRANTING RELIEF FROM THE AUTOMATIC STAY**

**THIS MATTER** having come before the Court upon the motion (the “Motion”) of Danielle Creacy (the “Movant”), for relief from the automatic stay, pursuant to the provisions of 11 U.S.C. § 362(d), by and through the Movant’s attorneys, Law Offices of Douglas T. Tabachnik, P.C. and, Beranbaum Menken LLP and this Court having reviewed the moving papers and having heard oral argument, if any, and for good cause shown, it is hereby

**ORDERED**, that the Movant’s Motion for Relief from the Automatic Stay is granted in all respects; and it is further

**ORDERED**, that the movant may name, as a nominal defendant, the debtor, BCBG Max Azria Group, LLC (“BCBG”), in any direct action filed against BCBG’s insurance carrier; and it is further

**ORDERED**, BCBG shall maintain and preserve all records related to its insurance coverage with AIG and its subsidiary, National Union Fire Insurance Company of Pittsburgh, Pa,
