**SIXTH MONTHLY APPLICATION OF GIBBONS P.C. FOR COMPENSATION
AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES AS COUNSEL TO THE DEBTORS
FOR THE PERIOD FROM JUNE 1, 2017 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2017**

Pursuant to the Court’s *Order Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals* dated January 31, 2017 [Docket No. 97] (“Interim Compensation Order”), and in accordance with section 330 of title 11, United States Code, Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2016 and Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2, Gibbons P.C. (“Gibbons” or the “Firm”) submits this application for compensation and reimbursement of expenses (the “Application”).

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FOR THE PERIOD FROM JUNE 1, 2017 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2017**

Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 330 and 331 (the “Bankruptcy Code”) and Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2016 as well as the *Order Authorizing the Employment and Retention of Gibbons P.C. as General Bankruptcy Counsel to the Debtors, Nunc Pro Tunc to the Petition Date* [Docket No. 99] (the “Retention Order”) and the *Order Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals* [Docket No. 97], Gibbons P.C. hereby moves the Court for reasonable compensation for professional legal services rendered as counsel to the above-captioned debtors and debtors-in-possession (collectively, the “Debtors”) in the amount of \$24,810.00 (80% of \$31,012.50) for the Sixth Monthly Period (June 1, 2017 through and including June 30, 2017), together with reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred as counsel to the Debtors in the amount of \$1,187.50. In support of this Application, Gibbons respectfully represents as follows:

BACKGROUND

1. On the Petition Date, each of the Debtors filed a voluntary petition for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.

2. No trustee or examiner has been appointed in these cases.

3. No creditors committee has been appointed in these cases.

4. Pursuant to the Retention Order, the Court approved the employment of Gibbons *nunc pro tunc* to the Petition Date. The Retention Order authorizes Gibbons to be compensated on an hourly basis and to be reimbursed for actual and necessary out-of-pocket expenses.

5. All services for which compensation is requested herein by Gibbons were performed for or on behalf of the Debtors.

SUMMARY OF SERVICES RENDERED

6. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is a detailed statement of fees incurred during the Sixth Monthly Period, showing the amount of \$31,012.50 due for fees.

7. The services rendered by Gibbons during the Sixth Monthly Period are grouped in the categories set forth in Exhibit A. The number of hours and total compensation sought for each category is identified in Exhibit A.

EXPENSES

8. Attached hereto as Exhibit B is a detailed statement of expenses incurred and paid by Gibbons during the Sixth Monthly Period, showing the amount of \$1,187.50 due for reimbursement of expenses. The expenses on Exhibit B are grouped by category. Costs incurred for computerized research are not included in the hourly billing rate of Gibbons and are billed without any surcharge.

VALUATION OF SERVICES

9. Bankruptcy Code section 330 sets forth the extent of compensation allowed to professionals employed under section 328. Under section 330(a), bankruptcy courts may award only reasonable compensation for actual, necessary services rendered by a professional. *See* 11 U.S.C. § 330(a). Reasonableness is based upon, among other things, (i) the nature of the services

provided; (ii) the extent of the services; (iii) the value of the services; (iv) the time spent on the services; and (v) the cost of comparable services in non-bankruptcy cases. *See In re Busy Beaver Bldg. Ctrs., Inc.*, 19 F.3d 833, 840 (3d Cir. 1994); *In re Lan Assoc. IX, L.P.*, 192 F.3d 109, 122 (3d Cir. 1999). The Firm respectfully submits that this Application is reasonable when measured in light of the factors governing the Court's analysis and that all of the services performed by the Firm were actual and necessary services.

10. In the seminal case of *Johnson v. Ga. Highway Express, Inc.*, 488 F.2d 714 (5th Cir. 1974), twelve (12) factors were set forth, which courts are encouraged to consider when determining whether fees requested are reasonable for purposes of section 330(a). The factors include:

- The time and labor required;
- The novelty and difficulty of the questions presented;
- The skill requisite to perform the legal service properly;
- The preclusion of other employment by the attorney due to the acceptance of the case;
- The customary fee charged by the applicant;
- Whether the fee is fixed or contingent;
- The time limitations imposed by the client or the circumstances;
- The amount involved and the results obtained;
- The experience, reputation, and ability of the attorneys;
- The "undesirability" of the case;
- The nature and length of the professional relationship with the client; and
- The extent of awards in similar cases.

11. The Firm submits that, under all of the applicable criteria to bankruptcy cases, and based upon the factors to be considered under Bankruptcy Code sections 330 and 331, the compensation sought herein is reasonable based upon customary compensation charged by comparably skilled practitioners in non-bankruptcy matters.

12. This Application covers the monthly fee period from June 1, 2017 through and including June 30, 2017. Gibbons has continued, and will continue, to perform additional

necessary services for the Debtors subsequent to the Sixth Monthly Period, for which Gibbons will file subsequent fee applications.

13. Gibbons expended a total of 62.40 hours in connection with this matter during the Sixth Monthly Period.

14. Gibbons believes that the time entries set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and the expense entries set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto are in compliance with the requirements of Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2.

15. In accordance with the factors enumerated in section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code, the amount requested is fair and reasonable given (a) the complexity of the Debtors' chapter 11 cases, (b) the time expended, (c) the nature and extent of the services rendered, (d) the value of such services, and (e) the costs of comparable services other than in a case under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.

16. Pursuant to the Interim Compensation Order, no proposed form of Order is required with this monthly application.

CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, Gibbons respectfully requests approval of the sum of \$25,997.50 for representation of the Debtors during the Sixth Monthly Period in the above-captioned chapter 11 cases. Gibbons request includes the sum of \$24,810.00 (80% of \$31,012.50) for compensation for necessary professional legal services rendered and \$1,187.50 for reimbursement of actual and necessary costs and expenses incurred during the Sixth Monthly Period.
