ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION AND REQUEST OF SALMAN CAPITAL, LLC FOR ALLOWANCE AND PAYMENT OF CLAIM UNDER 11 U.S.C. §§ 503(B)(3) AND 503(B)(4) FOR SUBSTANTIAL CONTRIBUTION

Upon consideration of the *Application and Request of Salman Capital, LLC for Allowance and Payment of Claim Under 11 U.S.C. §§ 503(b)(3) and 503(b)(4) for Substantial Contribution* (the “Application”), and the Court having scheduled a hearing (the “Hearing”) on the Application, and the Court having considered the relief sought in the Application, any objections thereto, if any, and the arguments of the parties, for the reasons set forth on the record; it is hereby

ORDERED that the Application is GRANTED; and it is further

ORDERED that Salman Capital is hereby GRANTED a claim for its substantial contribution to the Debtors’ bankruptcy cases pursuant to sections 503(b)(3)(D) and 503(b)(4) of the Bankruptcy Code in the amount of \$10,685.50, plus the cost and expense for the service of the Application and documents related thereto upon the parties set forth in the Debtors’ 2002 List by way of first class regular mail in an amount to be documented by counsel for Salman Capital (the “Substantial Contribution Claim”); and it is further

ORDERED that the Debtors shall pay the Substantial Contribution Claim to counsel for Salman Capital by no later than ten (10) days after this Order becomes final; and it is further

ORDERED that the proof of claim that Salman Capital filed with the Debtors' claims agent to document its Substantial Contribution Claim prior to the expiration of the general bar date shall be marked satisfied by the claims agent without further order of the Court after the Debtors pay the Substantial Contribution Claim as set forth herein; and it is further

ORDERED that the Court shall retain jurisdiction over this matter to the extent that any issues arise hereafter.
