**ORDER GRANTING MOTION BY CENTERPOINT ENERGY SERVICES, INC. FOR
IMMEDIATE PAYMENT OF SECTION 503(b)(9) CLAIM**

Upon the motion (the “Motion”)¹ of CenterPoint Energy Services, Inc. (“CES”), in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of Article XII(d) and Article XII(r) of the Plan, to compel immediate payment from the above-captioned Debtors² of the Claim, deemed an Allowed 503(b)(9) Claim in these Bankruptcy Cases pursuant to the 503(b)(9) Procedures Order and for the reasons further set forth in the Motion; and adequate notice of the Motion having been given as set forth in the Motion; and it appearing that no other or further notice of the Motion is necessary; and the Court having jurisdiction to consider the Motion and the relief requested therein pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334 as well as the retention of jurisdiction provision expressly set forth in the Confirmation Order; and the Court having determined that consideration of the Motion is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2)(A); and the Court having found and determined that it should exercise its discretion in accordance with the relief requested in the Motion and that the legal and factual bases set forth in the Motion establish just cause for the relief granted herein; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefore;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The Motion is granted.
2. The Reorganized Debtors shall render immediate payment of the Claim to CES in the amount of \$51,462.51.
3. The Court retains jurisdiction to hear and determine all matters arising from or related to the implementation of this Order.
