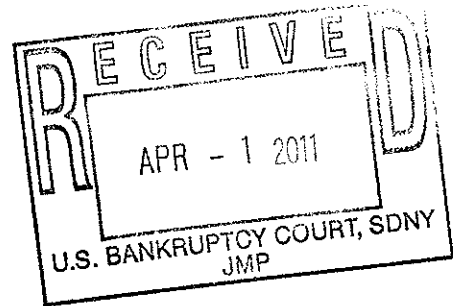

Reorganized Debtors' Fiftieth Omnibus Objection to Claims  
(Seeking to Expunge Certain Late Filed Claims)

Dear Honorable James M. Peck:

Please accept this as my Response regarding the above referenced matter.

Please note that although the Quebecor's Fiftieth Omnibus Objection to Claims contained instructions to reach Quebecor to potentially resolve my claim, my attempt to do that was met with a recording stating no one was available, followed a few days later by a voicemail left on my phone from JoAnn (last name unclear on voicemail), Quebecor representative in Quebec Canada, stating my claim is a claim being expunged and that I should call their counsel (I had already left a message for their counsel a few days before). I have since left two more messages for JoAnn to which she has not responded. I also placed another call to their counsel Arnold & Porter LLP. They finally responded and yesterday I was advised to file this Response.

This is the second time you are receiving a Response from me. The first time was December 8, 2009 when I responded to the same subject matter but at that time it was the Debtor's Tenth Omnibus Objection to Claims.

My background to this case is that I was a small business owner who dedicated my then start-up business to provide Quebecor World's Hazleton, Pennsylvania facility with new construction, renovation, maintenance and emergency work order services. I say "was" because Quebecor's failure to pay for services rendered has resulted in my need to close my business.

Your Honor, once again I implore you not to allow Quebecor World (USA) Inc., et al., to expunge my claim.

The facts remain:

- I provided multiple services to Quebecor World Hazleton, PA
- In each instance, Quebecor World Hazleton (Quebecor) accepted my services as satisfactorily completed
- Following each of Quebecor's acceptances of my services, invoices were submitted to Quebecor for payment
- Quebecor continued issuing Purchase Orders accepting my quotes and thereby contracting for my services
- I, like anyone providing a service, was and am fully expecting to be compensated in accordance with the terms of the Purchase Orders issued to me by Quebecor

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
- Quebecor World (USA) Inc., et al., was and is fully aware of the outstanding dollar amount owed to me for services rendered – at every step, they have represented \$59,380.00 is what I am owed
- I have not and do not dispute the amount owed
- Mr. Russ Snelling, Production Manager at Quebecor, represented no action was required on my behalf
- Mr. Snelling cited the reason no action was required because the records contained in Quebecor's computer system that he had reviewed indicated the full amount owed to me
- Mr. Snelling advised that only those people who do not have a dollar amount on file or those who dispute the dollar amount on file need to take action – I was and am not in either category
- Mr. Snelling, as a Manager at Quebecor, was a representative of Quebecor

In short, your Honor, I provided services which were satisfactorily accepted as complete, both Quebecor World (USA), Inc., et al., and I know I am owed money, neither they nor myself dispute the amount I am owed, I have followed the direction of Quebecor World (USA) Inc., et al., representatives in this process (First, Mr. Snelling – no action required; Second, Arnold & Porter LLP - file a Response to the Debtor's Tenth Omnibus; Now, Arnold & Porter LLP – the filing of this Response to the Debtor's Fiftieth Omnibus) and, last but not least, I need and want the money rightfully due me.

Sir, as I am not able to be present in person at the hearing scheduled for April 12, 2011 regarding this matter and my claim, I respectfully request that your Honor allow me to defend my claim and/or participate in this process by telephone. I will make myself available at the court's convenience and can be reached directly at 570.640.8731. Please have someone contact me with a call-in number, if applicable. Otherwise I will remain on standby to answer a call from the court should you see fit to grant my request.

Your Honor, please find a way to have Quebecor honor their debt to me. Although \$59,380.00 might not seem like a substantial amount to an organization as large as Quebecor World, to me, this large amount was the difference between my remaining in business or not.
