9. The primary reason TGR chose to do business with the Debtors was because the Debtors promised to store my high-karat gold at no charge to TGR.
10. Starting in September, 2011, I began sending shipments containing both low-karat gold and high-karat gold (and other precious metals) to the Debtors. Per our understanding, the Debtors refined and sold all of the low-karat gold (and other precious metals), and paid TGR within five to seven days after receipt of TGR's gold.
11. The Debtors also separately held and accounted for my high-karat gold that was stored in their vault, regularly sending statements to TGR identifying the gold that was in storage and being held on my behalf. At all times, I understood that the Bean Gold would be promptly returned upon request.
12. Periodically, the Debtors' representatives contacted me for the purpose of asking if I wished to also sell the high-karat gold to receive cash. Each time, I declined those requests, and I understand and expect that my high-karat gold remains in the Debtors' secure vault.
13. TGR currently has the following high-karat gold (and other previous metals) in storage at RMC's vault:
  - 1,036.045 troy ounces ("oz t") of 24K gold;
  - 148.517 oz t of silver; and
  - 0.899 oz t of platinum.
