Ms. Grafton:

The United Mine Workers of America ("UMWA") is in receipt of your September 6, 2018 letter requesting formal bargaining under Sections 1113 and 1114 of the United States Bankruptcy Code. Inasmuch as Westmoreland has not filed for bankruptcy protection, your request is premature. In the event, Westmoreland files for bankruptcy, please notify us immediately.

In addition, your letter proposes that the UMWA agree to elimination of retiree medical benefits that are statutorily imposed and required by the Coal Act. Issues involving compliance with Section 9711 of the Coal Act should be raised with the 1992 Benefit Plan's Board of Trustees.

Moreover, as you know the Kemmerer Agreement, contains successorship language requiring any purchaser to assume the collective bargaining agreement in its entirety. Please be advised that if Westmoreland enters into a sale of the Kemmerer operation, the Union intends to compel compliance with the agreement by the purchaser through all legally available means.

Finally, the UMWA wants to be crystal clear that any effort to eliminate retiree health care will result in an immediate work stoppage at Kemmerer, regardless of any transactions or agreements between parties other than the UMWA.
