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**STIPULATION AND AGREED ORDER RESOLVING DEBTORS’ THIRD OMNIBUS  
OBJECTION TO CERTAIN PROOFS OF CLAIM (FLSA CLAIMANTS)**

The WLB Debtors<sup>2</sup> and the WMLP Debtors<sup>3</sup> (collectively, with the WLB Debtors, the “Debtors”) in the above-captioned cases and Floyd Cozort, Bob Post, Brian Post, Evan Pargeon, Robert McLaughlin, Andrew Harper, Brent Grannon, Kalum Dixon, Jonathon Collins, Jason Carano, Luke Boone, and Michael Baisden (“Creditors,” and together with the Debtors, the “Parties”) hereby enter into this stipulation and order (this “Stipulation and Agreed Order”) as follows:

WHEREAS, on October 9, 2018 (the “Petition Date”), the Debtors filed voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Texas (the “Bankruptcy Court”). These chapter 11

cases have been consolidated for procedural purposes only and are being jointly administered pursuant to Bankruptcy Rule 1015(b) [ECF No. 71];

WHEREAS, on October 18, 2018, the United States Trustee for the Southern District of Texas (the “U.S. Trustee”) appointed an official committee of unsecured creditors pursuant to § 1102 of the Bankruptcy Code (the “Committee”) [ECF No. 206];

WHEREAS, the Bankruptcy Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1334, this matter is a core proceeding within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2), and venue is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409;

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2019, the Bankruptcy Court entered the *Order Confirming the Amended Joint Chapter 11 Plan of Westmoreland Coal Company and Certain of Its Debtor Affiliates* (the “Confirmation Order”) [ECF No. 1561] confirming WLB Debtors’ plan (the “WLB Plan”);

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2019, the effective date of the WLB Plan occurred (the “Effective Date”) [ECF No. 1608];

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2019, the Bankruptcy Court entered the *Order Approving Disclosure Statement and Confirming Amended Joint Plan of Liquidation for the WMLP Debtors, as Modified* (the “WMLP Confirmation Order”) [ECF No. 1967] confirming the WMLP Debtors’ plan of liquidation (the “WMLP Plan”);

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2019, the effective date of the WMLP Plan occurred (the “WMLP Effective Date”) [ECF No. 2068];

WHEREAS, each Creditor filed a claim against Debtor Westmoreland Resource Partners, LP (Case No. 18-35702) as set forth below:

- (a) Claim No. 14-1 filed by Floyd Cozort (DRC Claim No. 464);

- (b) Claim Nos. 7-1 (DRC Claim No. 457) and 21-1 (DRC Claim No. 649) filed by Bob Post;
- (c) Claim No. 6-1 filed by Brian Post (DRC Claim No. 456);
- (d) Claim No. 8-1 filed by Evan Pargeon (DRC Claim No. 458);
- (e) Claim No. 9-1 filed by Robert McLaughlin (DRC Claim No. 459);
- (f) Claim No. 11-1 filed by Andrew Harper (DRC Claim No. 461);
- (g) Claim No. 12-1 filed by Brent Grannon (DRC Claim No. 462);
- (h) Claim No. 13-1 filed by Kalum Dixon (DRC Claim No. 463);
- (i) Claim No. 15-1 filed by Jonathon Collins (DRC Claim No. 465);
- (j) Claim No. 16-1 filed by Jason Carano (DRC Claim No. 466);
- (k) Claim No. 17-1 filed by Luke Boone (DRC Claim No. 467); and
- (l) Claim No. 18-1 filed by Michael Baisden (DRC Claim No. 468) (such claims, for the purposes of ease of reference in this Stipulation and Order only, collectively, the “Claims”).

WHEREAS, the Debtors filed the *Debtors’ Third Omnibus Objection to Certain Proofs of Claim (Incorrect Debtor Claims)* [ECF No. 1786] (the “Objection”) whereby the Debtors requested that the Court modify each of the Creditors’ Claims to be allocated against Debtor Buckingham Coal Company, LLC (Case No. 18-35675) rather than Debtor Westmoreland Resource Partners, LP (Case No. 18-35702); and

WHEREAS, the Debtors and Creditors have agreed to resolve the Objection, as provided herein.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are incorporated into this Stipulation and Agreed Order, the Parties hereby stipulate and agree as follows:

1. The Parties agree that each Claim is hereby modified to be asserted only against both Debtor Buckingham Coal Company, LLC (Case No. 18-35675) and Debtor Westmoreland Coal Company (Case No. 18-35672).

2. All of the Debtors' objections with respect to each of the Claims are hereby preserved as this Stipulation and Agreed Order has no effect on them whatsoever. This Stipulation and Agreed Order is limited to the grounds stated herein. Accordingly, it is without prejudice to the rights of the Debtors to further object to the Claims, including the Claims as modified, on any grounds whatsoever. The Debtors expressly reserve all substantive or procedural objections as well as all rights, remedies, or defenses available to them under any applicable law against each of the Creditors and each of the Claims.

3. The Clerk of the Court is authorized and directed to update the claims register maintained in these chapter 11 cases to reflect the relief granted in this Stipulation and Agreed Order.

4. Except as otherwise provided herein, nothing in this Stipulation and Agreed Order, nor any actions taken pursuant hereto, shall be deemed: (a) an admission as to the validity of any prepetition claim against any Debtor entity; (b) a waiver of any Party's right to dispute any prepetition claim on any grounds; (c) a promise or requirement to pay any prepetition claim; (d) an implication or admission that any particular claim is of a type specified or defined herein; (e) a request or authorization to assume any prepetition agreement, contract, or lease pursuant to section 365 of the Bankruptcy Code; or (f) a waiver of the Debtors' rights under the Bankruptcy Code or any other applicable law.

5. Neither this Stipulation and Agreed Order, nor any actions taken pursuant hereto, shall constitute evidence admissible against the Parties in any action or proceeding other than one to enforce the terms of this Stipulation and Agreed Order.

6. The terms and conditions of this Stipulation and Agreed Order shall be immediately effective and enforceable upon entry by the Bankruptcy Court.

7. This Stipulation and Agreed Order is intended by the Parties to be binding upon their successors, agents, assigns, including bankruptcy trustees and estate representatives, and any parent, subsidiary, or affiliated entity of the Parties.

8. The undersigned hereby represent and warrant that they have full authority to execute this Stipulation and Agreed Order on behalf of the respective parties and that the respective parties have full knowledge of, and have consented to, this Stipulation and Agreed Order.

9. The Parties agree that each of them, through their respective counsel, has had a full opportunity to participate in the drafting of this Stipulation and Agreed Order and, accordingly, any claimed ambiguity shall be construed neither for nor against either of the Parties.

10. This Stipulation and Agreed Order constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior discussions, agreements, and understandings, both written and oral, among the Parties with respect thereto.

11. This Stipulation and Agreed Order shall not be modified, altered, amended or supplemented except by a writing executed by the Parties or their authorized representatives.

12. The Bankruptcy Court retains jurisdiction with respect to all matters arising from or related to the implementation of this Stipulation and Agreed Order, and the Parties hereby consent to such jurisdiction to resolve any disputes or controversies arising from or related to this Stipulation and Order.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**
